Messy Church

This afternoon, we will hold our monthly Messy Church from 4pm to 6pm. Messy Church is informal, fun and free. There is no need to book - just come along. We will have crafts, activities, stories, singing and a hot meal together. This afternoon, we will look at the themes of Remembrance and calling. Under 16s must be accompanied by an adult. If you can't manage this month, Messy Church meets on the second Sunday of each month.

Chuluchosema 1475 Challenge - £5 to feed a family

This year, St Columba's Church established a partnership with Chuluchosema CCAP church in Malawi. Some of us visited them in July and we are hoping that some of them will visit Glenrothes next year. Since we returned we have had several messages about the food shortage in Malawi. Most of the people in the Chuluchosema area are subsistence farmers who grow their own food, selling any surplus in local markets. This year, the maize crops have not been large enough for people to feed their families. There is maize available, but most people do not have the money to buy it. The congregation in Chuluchosema has set up a food distribution network through all the local families, not just the church families. There are 1475 families and 10kg of maize is enough to make a big difference for one family for a month. We are launching this challenge through Facebook and the internet in the hope that 1475 people would each donate £5, which is enough maize for a family for about 6 weeks.
